You may qualify if you

- are at least 18 years old by June 1, 2015
- are legally eligible to work in the U.S.
- are unemployed or underemployed
- are not academically prepared for college (based on Test of Adult Basic Education testing)
- have a HS Diploma or GED by June 1, 2015

Requirements

To participate, you must

- call to complete TABE testing and an intake interview
- be physically able to perform manufacturing work (requires heavy lifting and standing for 8–12 hours)
- commit to attending every class and completing about 10 hours of homework per week
