4-YEAR OR MORE COLLEGE DEGREE AND/OR EQUIVALENT EXPERIENCE

TRANSPORTATION, STORAGE &

DISTRIBUTION MANAGER \$39.74 Plan, direct, or coordinate transportation, storage, or distribution activities in accordance with organizational policies and applicable government laws or regulations. Includes logistics managers.

LOGISTICIAN \$31.52 Analyze and coordinate the logistical functions of a firm or organization. Responsible for the entire life cycle of a product, including acquisition, distribution, internal allocation, delivery, and final disposal of resources.

1-2 YEAR COLLEGE DEGREE (OR CREDENTIAL/LICENSURE)

DIESEL ENGINE SPECIALIST \$23.42 Diagnose, adjust, repair, or overhaul buses and trucks, or maintain and repair any type of diesel engines. Includes mechanics working primarily with automobile or marine diesel engines.

AUTO SERVICE TECH/MECHANIC \$17.84 Diagnose, adjust, repair, or overhaul automotive vehicles.

HEAVY & TRACTOR TRAILER TRUCK DRIVER \$21.89 Drive a tractor-trailer combination or a truck with a capacity of at least 26,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW). May be required to unload truck. Requires commercial drivers' license

TRANSIT & INTERCITY BUS DRIVERS \$18.61 Drive bus or motor coach, including regular route operations, charters, and private carriage. May assist passengers with baggage. May collect fares or tickets.

HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA OR GED AND/ OR EXPERIENCE

DISPATCHER \$21.80 Schedule and dispatch workers, work crews, equipment, or service vehicles for conveyance of materials, freight, or passengers, or for normal installation, service, or emergency repairs rendered outside the place of business. Duties may include using radio, telephone, or computer to transmit assignments and compiling statistics and reports on work progress.

LABORERS & FREIGHT, STOCK & MATERIAL MOVERS \$15.45 Manually move freight, stock, or other materials or perform other general labor.

HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE WORKER \$25.48 Maintain highways, municipal and rural roads, airport runways, and rights-of-way. Duties include patching broken or eroded pavement, repairing guard rails, highway markers, and snow fences. May also mow or clear brush from along road or plow snow from roadway.
